The Cheam First Nation and Shwaha'y Village are affiliated with the Sto lo Nation, but are not negotiating a treaty.

The Hupacasath, Diddah and Maa-nulth First Nations are affiliated with the Nuu-chah-nulth Tribal Council but are negotiating independently of the Tribal Council. Not all members of the Nuu-chah-nulth Tribal Council, Maa-nulth First Nations and Sto lo Nation appear within the extent of this map.



Where the Statement of Intent/Core Traditional Territory data overlaps, the colours are blended and are not represented by any colours in the legend.

The Statement of Intent/Core Traditional Territory data was obtained from the BC Ministry of Sustainable Resources Management in 2002. This coverage has been updated to include the new Hu'qum'num Treaty Group statement of intent/core traditional territory boundaries.

The Coast Salish World boundary was developed by the Hu'qum'num Treaty Group in consultation with Hu'qum'num Elders.
